

Field trip planned to shoot hummingbirds

Saturday, June 10, Khandan Nirmal planning a field trip to Dripping Springs to photograph hummingbirds, with a limit of 10 persons. Email Khandan: nkhandan@nmsu.edu if you are interested. The plan is to meet at the Dripping Springs Visitors Center at 8 a.m. for the shoot at the new Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks Monument. (Note: bring your Golden pass or \$5 and pay at the Visitors Center).

Khandan plans to set up 3 feeders and flowers the previous day to accustom the broad-tailed and black-chinned hummingbirds to the new feeders. The back ports of the feeders will be closed so the hummingbirds will come to the front for photos. He will have two

set ups- one with natural light and one with flashes/backdrops, so this alone will be a learning experience.

Bring a tripod, and either a 300 mm lens on full frame bodies or a 200 mm with a crop sensor bodies for best results. Remote release will also be useful. Attached photo shows the location of the shoot, which has been approved by BLM and the Park Manager. The plan is to shoot from the shaded patio on the left side of the entrance to the Visitor Center, from about 8 to 10 a.m. This time of day has nice side light coming off of the mountains that should help capture some nice close-ups. Themes

To talk about "mobile photography" is to be aware of two rules.

First, and perhaps most important, is that the best camera is the one you have with you. Since mobile photography has largely become the province of the smartphone camera (and since our smartphones have become surgically attached to most of us) the camera we have with us is almost always the mobile one.

Second, it is still reasonable to draw a distinction between "photos" and "snapshots," with the former denoting a higher quality image, and one with more artistic "value." Long, long ago in a galaxy far, far away (you know, 3 or 4 years ago) the images you took with your phone were snapshots, at best. Now they have the potential to be bona fide photographs. So much so, that the market for point and shoot cameras from Nikon, Canon, and other large companies is on the verge of going the way of, say, brick and mortar stores and the US Post Office.

The theme for May was Mobile Photography. There were 20 images submitted by 7 club members. A significant number of them were either shot in foreign countries or at events, suggesting that the "mobile" part of photography was paramount.

Next month's theme is **Alternative Editing / Digital Art**. Try to use some editing styles you haven't used before. Submit up to three of your most artistic images by sending them to Kristi Dixon at themes@daphotoclub. org by Saturday, June 17. Photos should be in JPG format, and should not exceed 2MB in size. Keep them no bigger than 1920 pixels wide and 1080 pixels tall. Include your name and a title with each photo.
