


# Night portrait shoot with Hannah and Autrey



# Alternatives to Adobe's Subscription Plan

Not a fan of paying monthly to edit your photos in Adobe's Photoshop/Lightroom?

Don't like the idea of "renting" your editing software? Once considered an industry standard, Adobe's Creative Suite's (now referred to as Creative Cloud) move to a subscription base has caused many photographers to search for other editing options, specifically options not requiring a monthly fee. Since this move, there has been an influx of new post-production options available to photographers, many with a one-time-only cost and some for free. Options include: Affinity Photo, ON1 Photo Raw, Google's Nik, Alien Skin Exposure X, Capture One Pro, PixelMator, PhotoScape, and PIXLR just to name a few. We are also seeing a rise in free to low-cost mobile photography editing apps like Snapseed, ProCam, PixelMator, and RAW; these mobile editing apps, especially Snapseed, are getting more pro-editing features on a regular basis.

While it's clear Adobe's subscription plan is working for professionals, many hobbyist and amateur photographers don't want to be tied in to a monthly fee just to edit photos. There are now plenty of options out there to just pay once and be done with it and own the program, some of the free editing options even come with photoshop-like features!
